NEXT MEETING : 7:30 DECEMBER 10, AT THE CVI, DUNCAN, BC

The Annual General Meeting of the Capital City Kart Club was held at the Silver Bridge Inn, Duncan, BC, November 1, 2003.

Tim noted that the work party at the track was successful, with all work completed, but it would have been easier with more volunteers. He thanked all the members who did show up. The Cassidy work party is still on, November 22. Tim noted that we had a good number of new members this year, and he hopes to see more next year. He reminded members that there would need to be a big work party in the spring before we start the 2004 season.

Kelly reported that we had a successful year, with no major problems.

Roy thanked all the club members who helped out during the year, and he hopes to see everyone back at the track in the spring.

James said that the club had a very successful racing season, but lack of volunteers did make things stressful at times. The new radios helped a lot. Our club once again demonstrated how to run a Regional race. Most people seemed to have a good time, and that is the criteria by which he judges a season's success.

Old Business:

- ❖ Steen Carstensen presented the **Regional Rules proposals** from the member clubs for BCKCA. They were read out and voted on, with the club reps being instructed to present the club's decisions at the BCKCA November Rules Meeting.

New Business:

- ❖ Roger Walker reported on **progress on the Outdoor Rec Park**. The Natives have disrupted progress by presenting an offer to buy the proposed Rec Park land at the same time TimberWest and the CVRD were negotiating the purchase of the land. In mid-September the CVRD contacted TimberWest asking the company to make a decision. In mid-October

the CVRD made their final offer to TimberWest, and TimberWest was to make a decision by November 5. The land was appraised at \$1.1 to \$1.4 million, which was higher than a previous appraisal. The CVRD has said it will accept outside investment to help pay for the increase. There was to be a special CVRD meeting to vote on the purchase of the property. TimberWest is to respond to the CVRD by November 19 at the latest. The provincial government has said it will fast track the zoning application if the CVRD is successful in purchasing the land.

- ❖ **Track lease renewal** was discussed. According to Steve Lorimer of TimberWest, the company has no plans for the property for the next 2 to 4 years. All that is slated for the property is environmental clean up around the perimeter of the property, and that could happen as late as next fall.
- ❖ The club's **Temporary Use Permit** was discussed. Apparently there have been 6 written and about 18 verbal complaints about the club, mostly in reference to traffic. There will be a meeting in Youbou, possibly in mid-November or early December.
- ❖ **Organization of the 2004 Port Alberni Grand Prix** was discussed. There was money left after all disbursements were made. Discussion of use of the remaining funds was deferred to the next meeting. We will form a Club Committee to organise, manage and fund the Port Alberni Grand Prix, the chairman of which shall be a club member.
- ❖ Dorothy Alexander presented **amendments to the constitution**, which are posted on this website.
- ❖ **Amendments to race and membership fees** were discussed. Single memberships will be raised to \$35, and family memberships will remain at \$75. The Rules Committee will set race-related fees.
- ❖ **Club** reps for BCKCA for 2004 were chosen and are Marty Venoit and Steen Carstensen.
